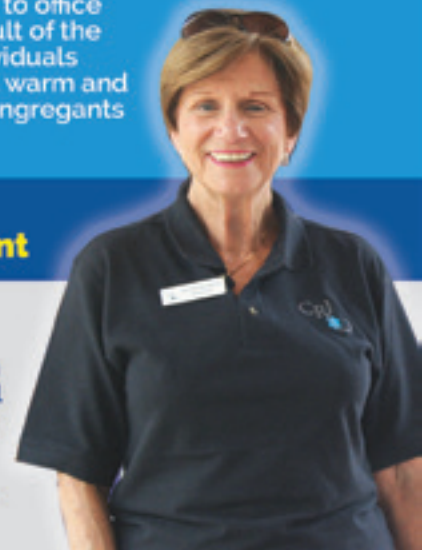

### Rabbi Steven Engel

Very soon we will be celebrating the holiday of Shavuot, which commemorates the giving of the Torah at Mount Sinai. Judaism teaches that God would only agree to give the Torah to the Jewish people if the people could

guarantee that the values taught in the Torah would be eternally embraced. The people offered their children as the greatest guarantors. Only because of this did God give the Torah to the children of Israel. Judaism realized early on that the words "our children are our future" is more than a nice gesture. Why? Because not only will they determine what the world looks like in which we will live. Not only will they be the ones to take care of us as we become the older generation. But more importantly, they will also be the ones that will insure that everything we hold to be dear and important and worked towards in our lives, will be held eternal as our tradition demands.

It baffles me then, that there are those who criticize, minimize, belittle, and even disregard completely our teens and young adults who have come forward in the last several months who have sought to make changes in our country and bring to the forefront the values that we believe in and want to hold eternal. I continue to marvel at how crucial volunteers are to the health, heart and vitality of CRJ. Most of our programs, special events, worship services and community outreach efforts depend upon the willingness of generous congregants who donate their time and talents in the service of their fellow members and the temple they love. These too-often unsung “worker bees” are the lifeblood of CRJ. So it is fitting that we thank and celebrate them on Friday, June 1st at a special Volunteers Appreciation Shabbat.

This year we will be honoring one especially deserving congregant with CRJ’s first-ever Volunteer of the Year award. The selection of Beverly Smith for this recognition by lay leadership and professional staff members was unanimous, a proverbial “no brainer” for those of us who witness Bev in action at the temple every week. Since joining CRJ almost twenty years ago, Bev has worked tirelessly in so many different capacities. Her Sisterhood involvement alone includes continuous service as a board member; chairing the annual Hanukkah dinner, Sisterhood’s single biggest fundraiser and a wonderful event that attracted 185 attendees last year; co-chairing the Second Night Seder, invitation sales and boot sales programs; and handling Sisterhood’s on line registration process for all of their programs and events.

But Bev has done, and is doing, so much more for CRJ than just Sisterhood-related tasks. Bev has worked on the Care Team since its inception and currently chairs that committee. She also chairs the Hospital Committee. Bev works as an office volunteer one day a week, serves as a Shabbat service greeter virtually every Friday night and periodically acts as the congregational bima representative. On two occasions, when an unexpected vacancy occurred on the Board of Directors, Bev agreed to step in and serve as Secretary for months-long stints. This year, Bev worked as Cantor Jacki’s production assistant and costume coordinator for the “Hamilton”-inspired Purimschpeil production on February 24 that set a new standard of excellence for temple performances.

When I asked Bev how she found CRJ after moving from Long Island to Orlando in 1987 to care for her mother, she explained that she went “temple shopping” once she decided to join a synagogue. After attending services led by Rabbi Engel at what was then the Congregation of Liberal Judaism, Bev immediately felt she was home. Her love of CRJ has

only grown over the years. Bev’s involvement with the temple deepened once she retired in 2007 after a demanding 30 year career as a commercial real estate paralegal. “I get more out of it than I give to it” is Bev’s simple explanation for why she puts in so many hours on CRJ’s behalf.

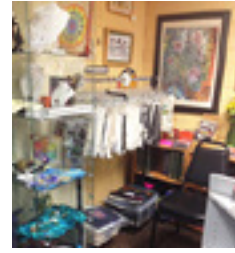

*"Without You, We Are One Sister Short"*

It's Spring, and Sisterhood has been busy. We were represented by Jean White, Rebekah Barkowitz, and Joan Kaspin at the WRJ (Women of Reform Judaism) Fried Leadership Conference, March 1-4 in Nashville. The conference is a high energy, informative, inspiring, and fun gathering of women from throughout the country. Rebekah was installed on the WRJ National Board of Directors. Joan attended sessions on social justice issues and plans to work with those of us who are interested in becoming more involved with WRJ social justice initiatives. Jean attended workshops on programming, engagement, leadership, and technology.

Highlights of the conference included an inspiring talk by Marian Wright Edelman, founder and president of the Children's Defense Fund. WRJ honored her with the Jane Evans "Pursuit of Justice" award. Rabbi Rick Jacobs, president of URJ, was the keynote speaker. He highlighted the common goals URJ and WRJ share in focusing on social justice issues. We enjoyed a high spirited Purimpalooza with music and fun. The conference closed with a powerful and heartfelt talk by Abby Brafman, a graduate of Stoneman Douglas High School and currently a freshman at Vanderbilt University. She spoke eloquently about gun violence and social justice. Listening to her and to the other young people who have been speaking out gives us hope for the future.

WRJ's newest advocacy campaign is WRJ Women Act. #wrjwomenact on social media. You can find information and resources at [www.wrj.org/womenact](http://www.wrj.org/womenact). WRJ has identified six high priority social issues to address: 1) pay equity; 2) violence against women; 3) reproductive rights; 4) economic justice and labor rights; 5) Israel and religious pluralism; and 6) immigration and refugee reform. During the conference, resolutions were passed on Affordable Housing and Child Marriage.

Sisterhood sponsored CRJ's 2nd Night Seder on March 31. It was a wonderful experience to share with our CRJ family, friends, and guests. Many thanks to Gary Becker for leading the Seder and to Beverly Smith, Brittany Armbrust, Helene Becker, Barbara Zaslovsky, Rachel Sacks, and Barbara Aggarwal for setting up the tables so beautifully. We also want to thank Sam for providing musical accompaniment and to Mike Velez for preparing the room and helping to clean up.

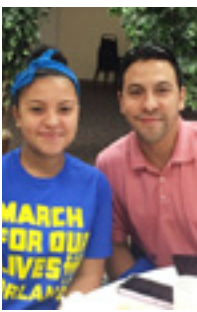
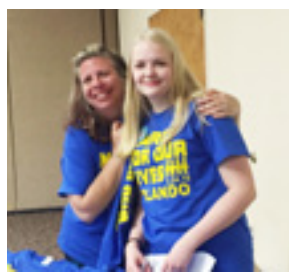
